Armistice Day coincides with **Veterans Day.** Today, people observe a twominute moment of silence at 11:00 a.m. local time. It is a sign of respect, in the first minute for those perished in war, in the second minute for those left behind.

Our Story

To give you just a bit of history about the Quilts of Valor® Foundation: QOVF.org or Quilts of Valor, is a foundation established in 2003 by Blue Star Mom, Catherine Roberts, after her son was deployed to IRAQ, literally with a dream.

She explained she was 10 seconds away from panic, 24-hours per day. She had a dream as vivid as real life. In her words she related, "I saw a young man sitting on the side of his bed in the middle of the night, hunched over with his head in his hands. The permeating feeling was one of utter hopelessness and despair. I could see his war demons clustered around, trying to drag him down to an emotional gutter."

Catherine continued, "Then, as if viewing a movie, I saw him in the next scene wrapped in a quilt. His entire demeanor changed - from one of hopelessness and despair, to one of hope and well-being. The quilt had helped make this dramatic change. The message of my dream was; quilts = healing."

Since 2003, nearly *198,000* Quilts of Valor® have been created and awarded to our Service Members and Veterans all over the world, including through major treatment centers such as Walter Reed Hospital and Brook Army Medical Center, VA centers and facilities, and especially through personal contact.

While the Quilt of Valor® is a major, once in a lifetime award, it is also meant to be used by the veteran. The quilts are made of the highest quality products and utilized the best available sewing and quilting techniques to honor the sacrifice and service of the receiving veteran.

TO NOMINATE A VETERAN OR ACTIVE SERVICE MEMBER TO RECEIVE A QUILT:

Go to <u>www.qovf.org</u> Under "take action", go to "request a quilt" and complete the information requested. The nomination will be forwarded to the appropriate representative and presenter. When a quilt is available, you will be contacted.

When you see someone in a uniform, Someone who serves us all, Doing military duty, Answering their country's call. Take a moment to thank them, For protecting what you hold dear; Tell them you are proud of them; Make it very clear. Just tap them on the shoulder, Give a smile and say, "thanks for what you're doing to keep us safe in the USA!" — Joanna Fuchs









Why flags are flown at half-staff;

In the sixteenth century, ships would lower their flag halfway as a sign of submission during battle, and it was said they were flying at "half-mast." On reaching port, the flag remained half-lowered in honor of those who had sacrificed their lives. In the seventeenth century the ritual moved to land, where it was said the flags were at "half-staff," as a sign of respect for any individual who had died serving his country beyond the call of duty.

NEWS FROM THE MICHIANA ALLIANCE OF CARE

Pantry director, Shelia Swinehart, reported unexpected changes at the Food Bank following the resignation of the Food Bank director resulting in difficulties with the day-to-day operation of the Food Bank as the staff reorganizes. Ordering and pick-up schedules, along with incoming FDA shipments, the MAC Pantry has had to adjust as well.

It is amazing how flexible the Pantry volunteers are. What it amounts to is in the variety of items available. The goal is to provide a mixture of items in the grocery bag which will help Pantry clients prepare as nourishing a meal as possible. The September statistics: 207 families, numbering 688 individuals were served.

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The Vineyard Church Food Drop occurred Sunday, October 14. The Vineyard Church is a long time member of the MAC. Volunteers come as a group once each month in order to <u>prepare for either a</u> <u>Tuesday evening or a Friday morning</u> Pantry Day. In announcing the October Food Drop, additional volunteers would be needed, and as always, people did step up. Approximately 3000 pounds of donations of all kinds were unloaded in two hours using the "bucket brigade" method with only one mishap, a jar of gravy.

At the end of the event volunteers gathered in the Albright UMC basement to see the results of their work by giving thanks to God for the love and fellowship, once again aware, "it does take a village". Respectfully submitted by Janet Freeman


