News from the MAC

The Mishawaka Alliance of Care and dedicated volunteers at the Food Pantry are keeping the wheels turning, as reorganization does take time. That being said, the clients continue to be served on the regular schedule. There was a timely response to an article in THE SOUTH BEND TRIBUNE.

The MAC Board believes there needs to be a division of the responsibilities for the Pantry to operate efficiently. Leaving that to just one person as administrator is asking a great deal; therefore, there will be a coordinator for each category, ie; food ordering, transporting and stocking; required computer input and reporting; working with volunteers who serve the clients. The goal is by using this cooperative model all requirements will be covered.

At the March Board meeting the client statistics were reported as:

Individuals, 546; Households, 184; Children, 178; over 60, 98; new clients, 14.

The Food Pantry is housed by Albright United Methodist Church but is a separate entity from the church. And every week many Mishawaka residents walk thru their doors. If you an empty space in your calendar, the commitment is for two hours per month: Tuesdays, 6 til 8 pm or Fridays; 10.00 am until noon. There are several jobs that require little more than just a smile for these neighbors. Thank You, Janet Freeman.

As in the past we will not be accepting computers/large electrical items.




