NEWS FROM THE MAC

This message comes from the HELP WANTED column of FIRST PRES NEWS where there is no lack of another mission opportunity.

The MAC Food Pantry is in need of people who have <u>two hours</u> during each month to serve as a volunteer. Albright UMC has provided a "home" for the Pantry for over twenty years. Some of the volunteers have served since day one. Now we find those folks have come to a place in their lives where the time has come where they have to say goodbye. At the last MAC Board meeting it was agreed to make the MAC congregations aware of the situation.

In addition to the two days the Pantry is open, each week there are other tasks needing volunteers, ie.

- preparing the food carts for folks visiting on Tuesday evenings and Friday mornings.
- Unloading the truck after a visit to the Food Bank in S. Bend; storing the food in the church basement;
- restocking shelves prior to Pantry days
- Only *TWO HOURS EACH MONTH*, please consider this opportunity.

March Statistics: Pantry: 194 households; 649 individuals served. Please keep in mind that most of these households are our senior population with several single parent households sprinkled in.

The Boy Scout troop from Coalbush Church delivered 1475 pounds from their food drive. The Pantry received 30 Easter boxes, each containing a ham, from Four Winds Casino.

Due to the recent flooding, the Elkhart Kroger store sent most of its undamaged inventory to the South Bend Food Bank. This allowed the Pantry Director to buy items for nine cents per pound rather than the normal cost of eighteen cents per pound. These items include laundry soap, paper products, and such.

Do you have a star? Your NEW Indiana Credential is needed by October 1, 2020.

A Real ID-compliant driver's license, permit, or identification card will be required for...

- Boarding federally regulated commercial aircraft (effective 10/1/2020)
- Accessing federal facilities that require identification to enter, such as military bases.
- 🚣 Entering nuclear power plants

At this time, these are the only places on the list BUT, I was informed, the list could be updated each year.

Indiana residents who want a Real ID must bring original versions or certified copies of the required documents to the license branch so they can obtain a new Real ID credential. Customers with questions about collecting their documents can call the BMV toll-free at 888-692-6841 and speak with a customer service representative for help or visit any Indiana license branch for assistance.

I have shared this information because I needed to update my license recently. I was not aware of this new form of identification, had not seen it in the paper, nor heard it on the news. There are several needed items (3 or 4) to get this **star**, visit REALID.IN.gov to learn more. Sue Rice
