On Sunday, November 13, 2016, 10 members of FPC were awarded Quilts of Valor. Quilts of Valor (QoV) is a nation wide organization of volunteers dedicated to providing quilts for veterans who have been touched by war and committed a period of their lives to defend the United States of America. Quilts of Valor Foundation has awarded nearly 148,000 quilts since it's founding in 2003 by Catherine Roberts whose son was deployed in Iraq.

Art Harker, Naval Reserves and Christopher Sulak, Afghanistan, were unable to attend.

Approximately 10,000 sew-ers all over the country are making quilt tops which are then machine quilted and completed for awarding to veterans. There are 5 certified quilt shops in Indiana in the program and one is Erica's Sewing and Craft center on N. Ironwood which is sponsoring the "InTheBend QoV" quilters which meets once a month at the shop to sew quilt tops.

This involvement with QoV began when Darlene Seufert, Lynett Heritz and Pam Camren attended a Presbyterian Women's gathering in April, 2015 where the speaker was the QoV Indiana state coordinator at the time. She explained what QoV was about and ask for volunteers to present quilts to nominated veterans in the northern part of Indiana. We volunteered and to date have awarded nearly 40 quilts to veterans from South Bend to Ft. Wayne. Each presentation is different but ALWAYS welcomed with great thanksgiving for being remembered for their service.
