II NEWS FROM THE MICHIANA ALLIANCE OF CARE NEWS

It has been a challenging two months for the MAC FOOD PANTRY, including Volunteers, Pantry Staff and most importantly, the folks who need help to feed the increasing number of client families each month. Adding to the difficulties were scheduled holidays, the bitter winter weather and volunteers who were not able to be there due to illness or transportation. As often happens, donations following the Christmas Holidays drop. That became obvious. The bins at the South Bend Food Bank were also affected.

In late Fall, Pantry Director, Shelia, received word from Granger Community Church the MAC FOOD PANTRY, was to be included in the annual FOOD DROP. On January 26, 2019.a very cold day, volunteers from GCC and MAC Pantry received approximately 2000 pounds food, more than the amount promised to the pantry originally. The MAC FOOD PANTRY was acknowledged as one of the best managed in the area in terms of meeting the needs of families in our community.

First Presbyterian Church joined other congregations in the community by collecting "soup makings" acknowledging Super Bowl Sunday. FPC donations weighed in at 64 pounds. Thanks to all who participated in this event.
