Greetings FPC!

As I begin, I wanted to let you know some of the initial steps I have been taking to get to know the congregation as your new pastor. These are short, 30 minute conversations that I am encouraging each individual member of the congregation to have with me. My goal is to get a "snapshot" of the current life, needs, and hopes of the church through these short, intentional conversations. In each conversation I will ask:

- 2) What do you think is the church's most pressing challenge currently? What do you think is a pressing need or challenge in the surrounding community of Mishawaka/South Bend?
- 3) What are your hopes and dreams for FPC?

In February we looked at experiencing Christ through "touch" and "sight." This month I look forward to unpacking "taste," "hearing," and "smell" with you. If you think you know someone who might be interested in this creative approach to Lent, make sure to invite them to church!

Finally, I hope to see you for Bible study Sundays at 9:00 before worship. This is a great opportunity for us to be a learning congregation, wrestling with scripture together, as we seek to discern the Spirit's leading.

NEWS FROM THE MAC:

At the February MAC Board meeting, Carol Minx, Food Pantry director of the Pantry reported 2015 statistics as follows:

Households served, 3126; People served, 10,607; Ages 60 +, 1263; New Households, 381; Children, 3544. As startling as these figures may be it is a drop of 803 from 2014; likely from a variety of circumstances and that is good news for the community.

News from the Food Bank of Indiana, guardian of Federal commodities, has given notice 2016 may see an increase in prices, as well as the availability of certain items, which will be a challenge to keep Pantry shelves filled. That is where using other sources comes into play. Volunteers scour local newspaper ads, work with the store managers in buying large quantities at sale prices and go shopping. Volunteer hours are all a part of Pantry work...at one time quoted as \$21.00 per hour. That is time donated by these dedicated folks. It does add up. Incidentally, both pounds and time are all a part of the required reports to the Federal Department of Agriculture.

Volunteer working on <u>Pantry Days</u> (Tuesday evenings and Friday mornings) is just one facet. Attending meetings ie., People Gotta Eat, driving the Pantry truck to the Food Bank, delivering food collections from member churches to the Pantry, keeping up with the cleanliness of the Pantry, including cleaning the grocery carts are examples.

It should be noted that Albright United Methodist Church has given the Pantry a 'home' which is a blessing in itself.

The MAC Board continues to search for a director to replace Carol. The Board is taking a look at perhaps dividing the responsibilities...sharing the work load....
As always, Volunteers are the backbone!

2015-2016 PW Bible Study: **COME TO THE WATERS** by Judy Record Fletcher

Lesson 7:Streams of Mercy-Forgiveness The March lesson was written specifically for Lent. The Scripture readings come from Isaiah 35: 1-2, 5-7; Psalm 51:1-12; Matthew 6:12

February's lesson was on Justice and Righteousness taken from the book of Amos. For the March lesson Fletcher turns our thoughts to forgiveness and mercy. The perfect topic for the Lenten season which is a time for penitence.

Isaiah 34 shows us God's harsh judgement against the faithless Israelites turning the streams into pitch and her soil into sulfur. In contrast, Isaiah 35 talks about the dry desert being glad and turning into bloom when God demonstrates his compassion and forgiveness. For a people living in a desert, this imagery of a dry land bursting into bloom would be a powerful metaphor for God's continuing love and compassion.

The Matthew passage addresses the question "What is Forgiveness?". The Lord's Prayer teaches us to "forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors". The passage also asks the question "What is Sin?". Fletcher writes, "Without God's forgiveness, sin builds up and our faith becomes dry and brittle like a parched creek bed." The third question is perhaps the hardest to answer, "How Do We Seek Forgiveness?"

A spiritual discipline used for centuries is the practice of examen. Put very simply, examen is a two step process. First affirm God's love, then confess our human weaknesses and our brokenness in relation to God. Read about examen on page 85 of the study book for more information.
