"Walking with God is walking with Jesus, restoring life to the bodies of the abused, making the wounded whole, healing the sick, touching the untouchables, and empowering women to their rightful place. It is weeping with those who mourn, releasing the life-giving power of God's love, challenging and confronting the powerful on the doing of justice and mercy in their temples and their palaces, and giving notice that the reign of God has come." - Allan Boesak

These words from *Lenten Reflections on the Confession of Belhar* are striking to me. They get to the heart of what it means to walk with Jesus as he carries the cross. They remind us that faith in the Jesus who bears our burdens calls us to solidarity with those who bear burdens today. This Lent I invite you to connect with someone in the spirit of Christian solidarity. Each day throughout the 40 days of Lent choose one person, cause, or issue where someone or some community is living under some form of personal or political burden. Once you have identified who that is for you, commit to praying for them daily and doing something to act compassionately on their behalf. This could mean reaching out to someone who you know is going through a really hard time, praying for them, and taking them to lunch. It could mean praying for the homeless in our community and committing to serve a meal at Hope Ministries in downtown South Bend. It could mean paying attention to how our elected leaders are making decisions that affect Muslims, immigrants, or refugees, praying for both our leaders and these affected communities, and making a commitment to call or write Congress reminding them that the call of Christian faith is to act with mercy toward the resident alien (Leviticus 19:10). Whatever you decide to do I pray your Lenten journey is blessed as you seek to walk with God. Pastor Travis



The Fig Leaf Boutique

125 E. Mishawaka Avenue, Mishawaka, IN 46545 Recently moved to the neighborhood!

The Fig Leaf Boutique is a clothing ministry sponsored by several churches in the area. It is a faith based, not for profit organization that collects clothing for distribution at no charge to those who are experiencing hard times. It is run by volunteers and has been in operation since 2012, just recently moving to the downtown Mishawaka location. Clothing is available for men, women and children. All items are totally free and each shopper is allowed ten items for each person in their family. Shopping is allowed every 3 months. There is a chapel on-site and prayer is available for anyone requesting it.

The boutique is open each Thursday from 10:30 – 1:30. (It is best to arrive by 1:00 so that enough time is allowed to complete the shopping experience.)

We welcome you to stop by and see our new shop.

NEWS FROM THE MAC: On Saturday, January 28, 2016, the MAC Food Pantry housed at Albright United Methodist Church received 174 boxes of food from THE FOOD DROP. This event has become an annual event organized through a joint venture of The Food Bank, People Gotta Eat, United Way and Granger Community Church. Over 1000 volunteers of all ages came together that cold Saturday morning. Children decorated the boxes with pictures, Bible verses, personal notes of well wishes. The boxes were packed with the donations of food which had been collected over several weeks. Trucks delivered the boxes to the pantries. Volunteers from Albright, along with folks from GCC unloaded boxes at each location, using the "bucket brigade" style which has always worked well. On reflection, at the end of the day, what we often hear, "It takes a village" rings true. These boxes will help keep the pantry shelves filled along with donations from the MAC churches throughout the next few weeks.

The Souper Bowl kettles collected 474 pounds of food! The Pantry shelves are full...Many thanks to all.
